Eternally Loved

Born and raised in Wisconsin, my parents had 6 biological children. When their youngest was 8, I was brought to the family as a foster child. Two years later they adopted me. I always knew I would be a foster mother and adopt children. Psalm 27:10 says, "Though my father and mother forsake me, the Lord will receive me. The truth is even as a child I felt my birth parents rejected me. They gave me away. The reason didn't matter. The parents I knew didn't do that to their kids. Mine did. When I read this Scripture it validated my feelings that I wasn't supposed to talk about. It made me trust God because it showed me He understood how I felt. The Lord revealed Himself to me when I was very young. Nobody ever had to teach me God loved me, I always KNEW He loved me. I hungrily read Scripture that helped me to understand who I was in Christ. In His Word I discovered that He is the one who formed me and knit me in my Mother's womb. He had a plan for me. I was created with a purpose despite how I was conceived. This is powerful information to a person who has been in foster care or adopted. I knew this was the "Good News" I was called to preach in my own home to my own family. I went to my first foster care educational meeting when I was 23 years old and pregnant with my 3rd child. They laughed at me, saying I was too young and busy to be a foster Mom. They told me I could have my own kids and didn't "need" more. My son was born and I spent the next 16 years in and out of Children's Hospital with my "special needs" child that was born with Hydrocephalus requiring numerous neurosurgeries. I had my 4th child yet my decision to adopt never wavered. As a Homeschool Mom I again went back and was told I could not continue to Homeschool if I wanted to become a foster parent. It clearly was not the Lord's timing yet. The years passed, two of my children married, my husband retired and I went to work full time.

The Lord revealed Himself to me when I was very young. Nobody ever had to teach me God loved me, I always KNEW He loved me. I hungrily read Scripture that helped me to understand who I was in Christ.

Three months later I was offered a promotion in Connecticut. My husband and I came out to look over the offer. We left Bradley International Airport and headed down Route 20. As we approached East Granby my spirit leapt within me and I exclaimed to my husband, "Can you feel it? We are home! Maybe the Lord is bringing us here to get the rest of our children we have been waiting for." A few months later we were invited to be foster parents by several people. This time they came looking for us. In one year's time we finished the classes, became licensed and now are in the process of adopting our 12 year old son. I have had the joy of telling this young man who Jesus Christ is, what the Bible says about him, his conception, his value and his future. Having no

knowledge of who God is or that he even existed, our son has accepted Jesus as his Savior. He has been delivered from a plethora of mind altering medications and is attending a real school for the first time. The Bible teaches us in James 1:27, "Religion that is pure and stainless according to God the Father is this: to take care of orphans and widows who are suffering and to keep oneself unstained by the world". Being a Foster/Adoptive Parent is not full time ministry-it is lifetime ministry. It changed my life - I am forever grateful that my adoptive parents chose to feed me when I was hungry, clothe me when I was naked and love me when nobody else wanted to. Today I am privileged to carry on their ministry. **LCWM**

Being Christian woman, many of us, if not all

of us are familiar with the virtuous woman described in Proverbs 31. In verse 20 we read that “She opens her arms to the poor and extends her hands to the needy.” Her arms and her hands are used for the undesirables of society. These people are often sinners, dirty, homeless, and misfits in our churches, schools, and neighborhoods. For the most part, all of us can say that our intentions in how we treat each other are good. We never mean to discriminate against people that may not fit into our neat little box of how we think they should look, dress, act, or speak, but we do.

Let’s take a look at the instruction that Paul gives to us as Christians when we come face to face with the opposite ends of ourselves or those we quite frankly, want to avoid at all costs because they make us so uncomfortable. **“My brothers, as believers in our glorious Lord Jesus Christ, don’t show favoritism. Suppose a man comes into your meeting wearing a gold ring and fine clothes, and a poor man in shabby clothes also comes in. If you show special attention to the man wearing fine clothes and say, ‘Here’s a good seat for you,’ but say to the poor man, ‘You**

stand there” or “Sit on the floor by my feet,” have you not discriminated among yourselves and become judges with evil thoughts?” (James 2:1-5). So what is Paul trying to say to us as moms, wives, and women of the faith? First of all he is saying to us “don’t show favoritism.”

In James 2:9 he plainly tells us that favoritism is sin. “But if you show favoritism, you sin.” Did you know that favoritism is a sin? I did not know this until I saw the scripture for myself. I do not believe that we purposefully sin but we do it out of ignorance. The consequences can be devastating. Have you ever considered that the uneasiness that we may feel when we come face to face with someone that we would consider an undesirable or misfit may quite possibly be the same uneasiness that they feel as well when they come face to face with us? We chase people away, damage, and even bring hurt and pain that they may be trying to escape. The scripture in Hebrews 13:2; “Do not forget to entertain strangers, for by so doing

some people have entertained angels without knowing it”; caused me to reflect on some of my own personal experiences. Maybe it was the man I saw at the end of the exit ramp just standing there with a sign held up, saying he will work for food, or the woman I see walking everyday with a wagon being pulled behind her full of empty cans or the man that rides his bicycle with the same outfit on day after day. Yet God is saying we should “entertain strangers.” What’s the answer? A deeper look at this command tells us the real meaning of “entertain stranger.” The Greek translation means to simply “be hospitable.” In Romans 12:1 Paul talks about our “reasonable service.” Well, 12 verses later he includes “practice of hospitality.” As for me, I will begin today using what God has revealed to me to touch the lives of people that others may simply overlook or just pass by. Just get divorced and move on! If you get pregnant by mistake, well, the world can fix that little problem for us, too. It's all about what is convenient, what feels good and what feels right. Party! Drink to excess, use illicit drugs. Celebrate! Lie and cheat your way to the top. Manipulate whom-ever you need to in order to fulfill your wants and desires. You only live once and it's all about me! Everyone else does it so it must be alright. Right?



If we were to take a poll of those in the world, or even for us followers of Christ with one foot in and one foot out, how many would say that they are truly happy? That they have peace? I would venture to say that a majority of the world is miserable, left striving to become some, or all, of what the world says we should be. This mentality and carefree behavior leaves a lot of room for Satan to move in and take over. In our insecurities to be good enough and to belong, we open doors of exploration—maybe I should hang with the cool crowd and try drugs. 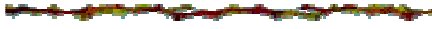

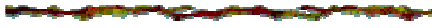
